David Malouf : Challenging Indifference

David Malouf is internationally recognised as one of Australia's finest writers. Among his novels, *The Great World* won the Commonwealth Writers' Prize and the Prix Femina Etranger in 1991 and *Remembering Babylon* was shortlisted for the 1993 Booker Prize and awarded the inaugural IMPAC Dublin Literary Award in 1996. David Malouf is also the author of stories, poems and libretti and delivered the prestigious Boyer Lectures in 1998 for the ABC. In 2000, he was awarded the Neustadt Prize for Literature for his body of work – joining a group which includes Nobel Prize winners Gabriel Garcia Marquez, Czeslaw Milosz and Octavio Paz.

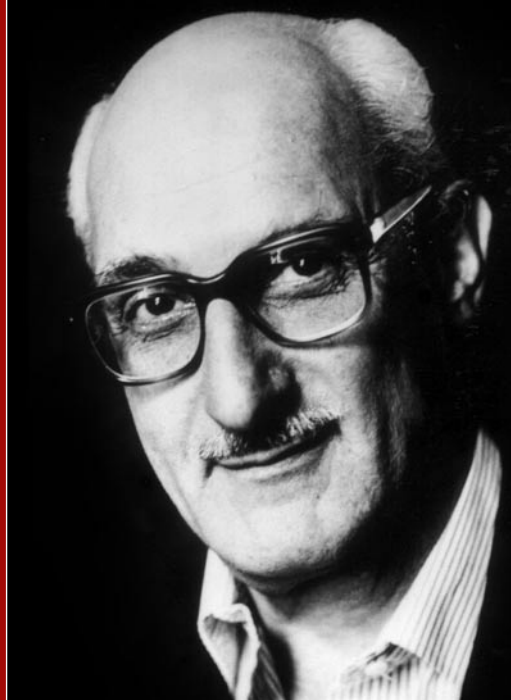
